



Policy: Tuition fee setting

Purpose

To outline the principles which underpin the setting of tuition fees for ANU programs and courses.

Overview

This policy provides the University with the principles for the setting of tuition fees for ANU programs and courses.

Scope

Academic staff—with delegations for corporate management of college or University programs and courses

Professional staff—with responsibilities for corporate management of college or University programs and courses

Policy statement

1. ANU program and course fees are set annually, and include a two-year projection of indicative fees.
2. ANU fees:
 - a. Align with strategic and operational priorities including; marketing and recruitment strategies, competitor analysis, and market sensitivity.
 - b. Include all fees and consider alongside accommodation pricing, student and revenue forecasts, and confirm for five years, subject to an annual rolling review to consider changes in the operating environment.
 - c. Continue to maintain a small number of different pricing bands to ensure ease of communication to students.
 - d. Set fees within the 75th (upper quartile) of comparable national and international competitor levels, and set at the discipline not course level, ensuring that students are charged the same fee for a course in the same discipline regardless of where it is taught on campus.
 - e. Sufficiently cover the cost of delivering programs that meet monitored institutional quality levels, and comply with regulations, acts or other government requirements or changes relevant to the setting of fees.

3. Fees are applied at the individual course level. Program fees vary depending on an individual's enrolment practice.

5. International course fees are allocated by broad discipline to five fee bands (Table B). Undergraduate, Postgraduate coursework and Higher Degree Research fees may have different fee bands applied.
6. Domestic fee paying places have an adjustment down applied (Table C).

A classification system determined by the Australian Bureau of Statistics used to describe subject areas or disciplines in broad, narrow and detailed fields in education contexts. Broad fields are distinguished from each other on the basis of theoretical content and the broad purpose for which the study is undertaken. Narrow fields are distinguished from other narrow fields in the same broad field on the basis of the objects of interest, and the purpose for which the study is undertaken. Detailed fields are distinguished from other detailed fields in the same narrow field on the basis of methods and techniques, tools and equipment, and a stricter application of the criteria used for broad and narrow fields. For example, detailed field 010101-Mathematics - Mathematics is the study of deductive systems, including algebra, arithmetic, geometry, analysis and applied mathematics.
